



CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

Young Scientist Prize

of the
Atomic, Molecular, and Optical Physics Division (AMOPD)
of the **European Physical Society (EPS)**

Nominations are being sought for the Young Scientist Prize in Atomic, Molecular and Optical Physics which will be awarded by the AMOPD Division of the EPS for the third time in 2022. The award ceremony will take place during the fourteenth European Conference on Atomic and Molecular Physics (ECAMP XIV) to be held in Vilnius, Lithuania, June 27 – July 1, 2022.

The prize includes

- a medal
- a cheque in the amount of EUR 1,500
- and an invited talk at ECAMP XIV.

The nominee is expected to have made original and outstanding contributions to the field of AMO physics. The leading personal contribution of the nominee to the achievements must be clearly identifiable when the work was performed in collaboration. Nominees for the prize should have, as of January 1, 2022, a maximum of 8 years of research experience following the PhD (excluding career interruptions such as maternal leave or mandatory military service).

Nominations should include:

- A letter of not more than 1,000 words summarizing the nominee's achievements and identifying the specific work to be recognized
- A list of all publications
- A brief biographical sketch not exceeding two pages

Self-nominations will not be considered.
